
BOOK CARE

Characters

The people and animals you meet in a story.





Setting

The when and where the story happens.

Plot

Events that happen in the story.



Problem

What goes wrong in the story.

Solution

How the problem is solved.





Theme

The main idea or message learned from the story.





READING GENRES

Fantasy

Story includes elements that are impossible such as animals talking or magical powers




Mystery

Stories that build curiosity as they try to solve puzzles and uncover clues alongside the characters.



Fiction

"What if" stories, illusion of reality.
Events could happen in real world, characters seem real; contemporary setting.



Non-Fiction

Facts about the real world.
Informational books that explain a subject or concept.



Poetry

Also called verse is a form of literature that uses aesthetic and often rhythmic qualities of language



Folk Tales

Traditional stories, myths, and legends, from the past. Oral tradition; no known author.




Biography

Science Fiction


Stories with ideas from science, like robots and spaceships.


